Safe Church is the name of our diocesan safeguarding policy. The purpose of this policy is to promote the mission of the church by providing a safe working and spiritual environment. This policy requires those who work or volunteer at St. Paul's, particularly those who have actual or potential exposure to vulnerable persons, to complete a quick online training session and acquire a police background check.

Our parish Safe Church officer, Pam Iype, has by now reached out to all those who require these to fulfill their role at St. Paul's. As most will know, background checks are needed to volunteer with any community organisation - the church is not an exception. As a community of faith, we should seek to hold ourselves to the highest standards in our care for one another. Welcome to St. Paul's and to this Eucharist. In it we recall the last meal of Christ with his friends in the Upper Room as we celebrate his presence with us now in the breaking of bread.

All baptised Christians are welcome to receive Holy Communion today. Please proceed to the altar rail or to the communion station at the side altar if you wish to receive. If you do not wish to receive from the chalice, cross your arms over your chest.

Intinction (dipping the host into the chalice) is not permitted at St. Paul's.

If you would like Holy Communion brought to your pew, please notify a sidesperson prior to the beginning of the liturgy.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Please be seated.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (1:15-17, 20-26)

In those days Peter stood up among the believers (together the crowd numbered about one hundred and twenty people) and said, 'Friends, the scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit through David foretold concerning Judas, who became a guide for those who arrested Jesus— for he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.' 'For it is written in the book of Psalms, "Let his homestead become desolate, and let there be no one to live in it"; and "Let another take his position of overseer." So one of the men who have accompanied us throughout the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these must become a witness with us to his resurrection.' So they proposed two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also known as Justus, and Matthias. Then they prayed and said, 'Lord, you know everyone's heart. Show us which one of these two you have chosen to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.' And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias; and he was added to the eleven apostles. *The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.*

God abides in those who confess that Jesus is the Son of God, and they abide in God. So we have known and believe the love that God has for us. God is love, and those who abide in love abide in God, and God abides in them. *The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.*

Reader. The Holy Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ according to Saint John. (17:11-19)

People Glory be to thee, O Lord.

Lifting up his eyes to heaven, Jesus prayed saying: now I am no longer in the world, but they are in the world, and I am coming to you. Holy Father, protect them in your name that you have given me, so that they may be one, as we are one. While I was with them, I protected them in your name that you have given me. I guarded them, and not one of them was lost except the one destined to be lost, so that the scripture might be fulfilled.

But now I am coming to you, and I speak these things in the world so that they may have my joy made complete in themselves. I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world. I am not asking you to take them out of the world, but I ask you to protect them from the evil one. They do not belong to the world, just as I do not belong to the world.
