
Welcome to St. Paul's



A note about bells

Christians have been using bells as part of our worship since the 5th century. Bells are rung to "make a joyful noise unto the Lord", as the Psalmist urges. Thank you to Jeff McCluskey, who has been ringing our bell on Sunday mornings. Thank you also to Matthew Way, who has been playing the carillon following worship on Sunday.

Several people have also asked questions about the bells that were in use during our services on Holy Thursday evening, at the Easter Vigil and on Easter Sunday. These bells are called 'sanctus bells.' They are used across several Christian denominations - Lutheran, Roman Catholic, Orthodox, and Anglican. Originally, bells were just in the towers of churches. Later, they were scaled down and used inside during the Eucharist to add to the beauty and mystery of worship and to call everyone's attention to certain important moments. At Easter, we rang the bells at the Gloria to highlight its restoration to the liturgy after Lent and to heighten our celebration of the Resurrection. Bells are used ordinarily used at the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) and at the consecration, when, at the words of institution ('this is my body...this is my blood'), we believe Jesus becomes present with us in a real and special way. We do not own our own sanctus bells at St. Paul's - they were borrowed. However, if you appreciated their use and would like to hear them used at other special times during the year, you might consider making a donation or memorial towards the cost (approx. \$150).



THE HOLY EUCHARIST on the FOURTH SUNDAY AFTER EASTER

28 April 2024 at 10 a.m.

Welcome to St. Paul's and to this Eucharist. In it we recall the last meal of Christ with his friends in the Upper Room as we celebrate his presence with us now in the breaking of bread.

All baptised Christians are welcome to receive Holy Communion today. Please proceed to the altar rail or to the communion station at the side altar if you wish to receive. If you do not wish to receive from the chalice, cross your arms over your chest.

Intinction (dipping the host into the chalice) is not permitted at St. Paul's.

If you would like Holy Communion brought to your pew, please notify a sidesperson prior to the beginning of the liturgy.

THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

Please be seated.

A Reading from the Acts of the Apostles (4:8-12)

When Saul had come to Jerusalem, he attempted to join the disciples; and they were all afraid of him, for they did not believe that he was a disciple. But Barnabas took him, brought him to the apostles, and described for them how on the road he had seen the Lord, who had spoken to him, and how in Damascus he had spoken boldly in the name of Jesus. So he went in and out among them in Jerusalem, speaking boldly in the name of the Lord. He spoke and argued with the Hellenists; but they were attempting to kill him. When the believers learned of it, they brought him down to Caesarea and sent him off to Tarsus. Meanwhile the church throughout Judea, Galilee, and Samaria had peace and was built up. Living in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it increased in numbers. *The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.*

Psalm (22:25-31)

25 Of thee cometh my praise in the great congregation; / my vows will I perform in the sight of them that fear him. 26 The poor shall eat and be satisfied; they that seek after the LORD shall praise him; / may your heart live for ever. 27 ALL the ends of the world shall remember, and be turned unto the LORD; / and all the kindreds of the nations shall worship before him. 28 For the kingdom is the LORD'S / and he is the Governor among the nations. 29 Surely to him shall all the proud of the earth bow down; / and before him shall kneel all that go down into the dust, and he that cannot keep his soul alive. 30 Their posterity shall serve him; / it shall be told of the Lord unto a generation yet to come. 31 And men shall declare his righteousness / unto a people that shall be born, that he hath done it.

A Reading from the First Letter of John (3:18-24)

Little children, let us love, not in word or speech, but in truth and action. And by this we will know that we are from the truth and will reassure our hearts before him whenever our hearts condemn us; for God is greater than our hearts, and he knows everything. Beloved, if our hearts do not condemn us, we have boldness before God; and we receive from him whatever we ask, because we obey his commandments and do what pleases him. And this is his commandment, that we should believe in the name of his Son Jesus Christ and love one another, just as he has commanded us. All who obey his commandments abide in him, and he abides in them. And by this we know that he abides in us, by the Spirit that he has given us. *The Word of the Lord. Thanks be to God.*
