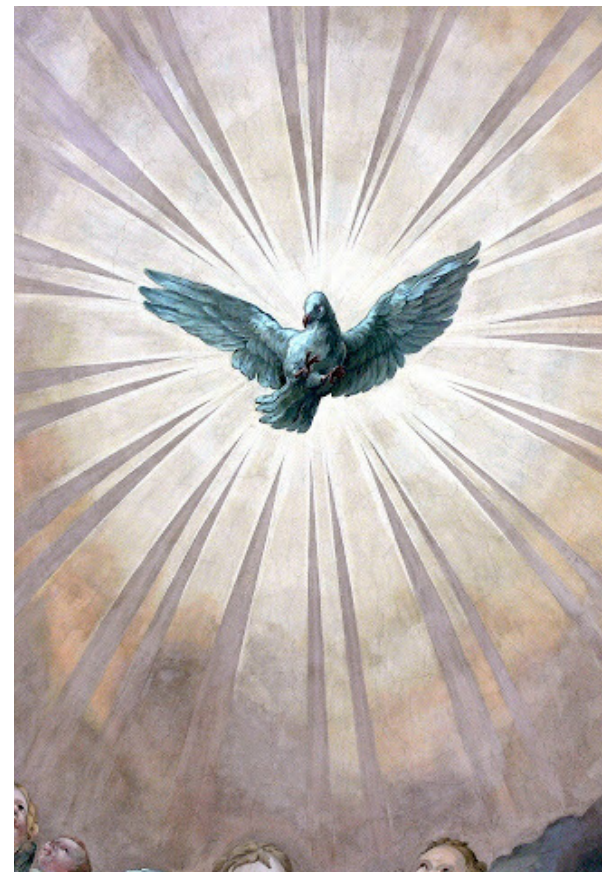

Visit of Archbishop David Edwards

This Sunday we welcome Archbishop David Edwards and his wife Debbie to our parish. At the 10 a.m. service, our parish will present Sean Johnston and Sarah Maynard for confirmation. Please join us in supporting these young people as they make the faith they've received in baptism their own! There will be a parish picnic to follow (see below).

What is Confirmation?

In Confirmation we take up for ourselves the promises made by our parents and godparents on our behalves at our baptisms: promises to eschew evil and to practice the life of faith. We cannot uphold these promises in our own strength, so the Bishop lays his hand upon us and prays that the Holy Spirit would enable us to do all that we have promised to do. Confirmation is to the individual Christian what Pentecost is to the Church.

Today at their confirmations, the parish will present Sean and Sarah each with a hand painted wall cross, a visible symbol of the presence and love of Christ.
